He was Deputy Foreign Minister in 2000-2002 and served as an Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary to the Hellenic Republic (2003-2007) and to Hungary (March 2009- March 2013). The State Minister of Georgia on European and Euro-Atlantic Integration met with the Council of Public Advisors on Georgia's Integration into EU

On April 11th 2013, the State Minister of Georgia on European and Euro-Atlantic Integration **Alex Petriashvili** hosted the Council of Public Advisors on Georgia's Integration into the EU at the Chancellery of the Government of Georgia. The agenda of the meeting focused on dynamics of negotiations around the Association Agreement of Georgia with the EU.

On behalf of EUGBC, Country Representative and Member of the Advisory Council, **Tamar Khuntsaria** participated in the meeting.

The first Deputy Minister of Foreign Affairs **David Zalkaliani** stated that the negotiation on the Association Agreement was basically over and the parties continued work on technicalities.

The new Government highlighted the fact that they had to deal with the toughest parts of the Association Agreement, though the European prospect and the Security issues of Georgia are fully reflected into the text. "We would like to keep the civil society informed about the process of negotiations. The last round of the negotiation on the Association Agreement was recently held. Today, we have all reasons to claim that the initialing of Association Agreement will be possible at the Vilnius Summit this autumn," – stated Alex Petriashvili.



According to the State Minister the work on the document is finished. It will take some time to start the legal and technical refinement of the Association Agreement text after finalizing the technicalities. "We will inform the EU and the public that the agreement on political association has been reached and the negotiation on the initialing of the Association Agreement between Georgia and the EU is over," – declared the State Minister.

The Deputy Minister of Economy and Sustainable Development **Mikheil Janelidze** familiarized members of the Council of Public Advisors on Georgia's Integration into the EU with the process of negotiations over the Deep and Comprehensive Free Trade Agreement (DCFTA).

Active discussions and questions concerning the procedures and dates of enactment of the Association Agreement were the highlights of the meeting. The participants sought to learn more about the implementation procedures of the Association Agreement in specific fields (competition, energy, environment, non-tariff barriers). The parties agreed upon the importance of raising public awareness and involvement of the non-governmental sector in the process.

Background information: the Council of Public Advisors on Georgia's Integration into the EU was created in 2005. The representatives of non-governmental organizations, academic circles, and media, as well as independent experts take active part in the work carried out by the Council. For the purpose of enhancing the dialogue with public the Council arranges consequent meetings with the above mentioned representatives and discusses the priority topics for Georgia's integration into the EU and other relevant issues.

Representatives of EUGBC met with the EU Member States Ambassadors at the EU Delegation to Georgia

On April 16, 2013 EU-Georgia Business Council (EUGBC) Country Representative, **Tamar Khuntsaria** and Member of EUGBC Board, **David Lee** met with the EU Member States Ambassadors at the EU Delegation in Tbilisi. The aim of the meeting was to inform the European high ranking diplomats on the role and activities of EUGBC.

The meeting was chaired by **Ambassador Phillip Dimitrov**, Head of the EU Delegation to Georgia.

Tamar Khuntsaria delivered a brief presentation on EUGBC's goals, its key activities and projects both in Georgia and in Brussels. Ms. Khuntsaria thanked the EU Delegation for supporting EUGBC's work in raising awareness on the trade rules and practices in the EU. She presented a number of publications and seminars carried out by EUGBC in cooperation with the EU Delegation.

In addition she discussed the mission, objectives, composition and major activities of the Deep and Comprehensive Free Trade Area (DCFTA) Working Group established by EUGBC last year. The Country representative also informed the audience on the meetings held with the European and Georgian negotiating sides in the scope of the WG. Ms. Khuntsaria underlined the role of the DCFTA WG in promoting active dialogue of the business community with the European and Georgian sides involved in the AA/DCFTA negotiations.

David Lee also spoke with the audience on the mission and the role of EUGBC as a major European business association promoting trade and economic relations between EU and Georgia. He informed the European Ambassadors on the composition of the Council's Board and membership. David Lee stressed that given the active phase of EU-Georgia cooperation in the scope Association Agreement (AA) negotiations, it is essential for the Brussels-based EUGBC to increase its presence and visibility in Georgia, which means expansion of members network and regular meetings with the government and diplomatic corps. David Lee spoke of the active role of EUGBC Network Committee to this end. He asked the Ambassadors to closely cooperate with the Council and regularly meet the members.

On the occasion of the 12th meeting of the EU-Georgia Subcommittee on Trade, Economic and related Legal Issues on June 3rd 2013 in Tbilisi, the EU Delegation organized a meeting of business representatives from Georgia with **Philippe Cuisson**, Representative of Directorate General for Trade (DG Trade) of European Commission (EC), Chief Negotiator on DCFTA with Georgia from EU and the colleagues from Brussels in the margin of the Trade Subcommittee.

On behalf of EUGBC, Vice Chairman of the Board, **Badri Japaridze**, Members of the Board, **David Lee** and **Nick Gvinadze** and Country Representative, **Tamar Khuntsaria** took part in the meeting.

The Brussels delegation, chaired by Mr. Cuisson and composed of representatives from DG Trade and DG ECFIN, briefed the meeting participants about the current state of negotiations on Deep and Comprehensive Free Trade Area (DCFTA) between the EU and Georgia as well as discussed the current economic and trade situation in Georgia.

Philippe Cuisson informed that the negotiations on DCFTA with Georgia, which was launched in February 2012, will be concluded by July 2013. Concluding the negotiations speedily, he said, demonstrates high commitment of both Georgian and EU sides to the negotiations process. Mr. Cuisson further stated that the text of the agreement will be initialized in the end of the current year, and most likely signed in the end of 2014 or the beginning of 2015. After signing the text, before entering into force, it will be translated in 28 languages (for every EU member state), followed by the ratification by Georgian parliament, European Parliament and all EU member states parliaments. It is therefore anticipated to have the DCFTA in force by the end of 2015.

According to Mr. Cuisson, once having the DCFTA fully in force, it will have a significant affirmative impact on Georgia's overall economic performance. First of all, it will increase trade activity and will thereby have a positive effect on the revenues in the country. Besides, in a long run, DCFTA will certainly stabilize economy and boost the confidence of investors. Moreover, signing a DCFTA with the EU does have a political implication as it will vividly demonstrate Georgia's European choice. The meeting was concluded by questions and discussion.

The NATO Secretary General's Special Representative for the Caucasus and Central Asia, James Appathurai paid a working visit to Georgia

On June 3rd 2013, the NATO Secretary General's Special Representative for the Caucasus and Central Asia, Mr. **James Appathurai** paid a working visit to Georgia. The main goal of the visit was to prepare for the North Atlantic Council's (NAC) visit to Georgia.

Mr. Appathurai held meetings with the Prime Minister **Bidzina Ivanishvili**, the President **Michael Saakashvili**, the Speaker of the Parliament **Davit Usupashvili**, the State Minister for European and Euro-Atlantic Integration **Alex Petriashvili**, the Secretary of the Security Council **Giga Bokeria** and the Parliamentary minority leader **Davit Bakradze**.

The NATO Special Representative reaffirmed NATO's strong support for Georgia's territorial integrity and sovereignty as well as for the policy of not recognizing the so-called "independence" of Georgia's occupied regions. Mr. Appathurai also underlined once again the fact that the Alliance will adhere to the decision of the Bucharest summit concerning Georgia's further integration with NATO.



The NATO Special Representative also declared that the installation of wire fences along the Tskhinvali region's occupation line by the Russian occupation forces is unacceptable and contradicts international law.

The NATO Secretary General's Special Representative also took part in various events held to mark NATO Week and delivered a speech during the Week's opening ceremony, which was also attended by representatives of other NATO aspirant countries (Bosnia & Herzegovina, the Former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia, and Montenegro).

The Newly Appointed Secretary General of EUGBC held a meeting with the Ambassador Philip Dimitrov, Head of the EU Delegation to Georgia



On June 5th, 2013 an introductory meeting of the newly appointed Secretary General of EUGBC, Ambassador **Zviad Chumburidze** with the Head of the EU Delegation, Ambassador **Philip Dimitrov** was held at the EU Delegation.

Mr. Chumburidze and Mr. Dimitrov discussed the current activities and future plans of EUGBC, as well as current state of EU-Georgia relations.

Ambassador Dimitrov reaffirmed his strong support to the Council and stressed the significance of close cooperation between the EU Delegation and EUGBC.

Mr. Chumburidze thanked the Ambassador for his support and congruently underlined the importance of close collaboration of the Council with the Delegation. He also emphasized that given an active phase of EU-Georgia relations an increased role of EUGBC both in Georgia and in Brussels is crucial.

During his visit Mr. Haton participated in EUGBC Board and Annual Members' Meetings in Tbilisi on June 18th. In addition, Emmanuel Haton met with the Deputy Minister of Foreign Affairs of Georgia, **David Jalaghania**, State Minister for European and Euro-Atlantic Integration, **Alex Petriashvili**, Head of EU Delegation to Georgia, **Ambassador Philip Dimitrov**, British Ambassador to Georgia, **David Moran**, French Ambassador to Georgia, **Renaud Salins**, Ambassador to Belgium and Luxemburg and Head of Georgian Mission to the EU, **Natalie Sabanadze**. During the visit, the Chairman of the Board also held meetings with **BP Georgia C&EA team** and visited Georgian brandy company "**Sarajishvili**".

On the occasion of the visit of Emmanuel Haton to Georgia, on June 18th EUGBC offered an informal dinner to the Council's Board and Network Committee members. The dinner was attended by Ambassador Natalie Sabanadze.

The EU-Georgia Business Council (EUGBC) elected a new Board

On June 18, 2013 EUGBC held its Annual Members' meeting at the member TBC Bank head office in Tbilisi.

In the beginning of the meeting, the Chairman of the Board presented to the members the Council's new Secretary General, **Ambassador Zviad Chumburidze**. Mr. Chumburidze greeted the members and spoke on the Council's future plans and envisioned activities during 2013-2014.



At the meeting, the members of EUGBC elected **Emmanuel Haton** from BP Europe as a Chairman of the Board, **Badri Japaridze** from IDS Borjomi Georgia as First Vice-Chairman of the Board and **David Lee** from Magticom as Second Vice-Chairman of the Board. **Anders Marvik** from Statoil, **George Chirakadze** from UGT, **Nick Gvinadze** from Gvinadze and Partners LLC, **John Braeckveldt** from Gosselin Moving Georgia and **David Loladze** from Qatar Airways were elected as Directors of the Council (members of EUGBC Board).

The EUGBC members thanked **Geir Westgaard**, former Director of the Board from Statoil for his support and contribution to the Council in the previous years and welcomed his successor Anders Marvik to EUGBC Board.

The members of EUGBC met with the new Ambassador of Georgia to Belgium and Luxemburg and Head of Georgian Mission to the EU and the French Ambassador in Georgia at Annual Members' Meeting in Tbilisi

On 18 June 2013, EUGBC Annual Members' Meeting was held in EUGBC member TBC Bank's head office in Tbilisi. The meeting was opened by **H.E. Mr. Renaud Salins**, Ambassador of France to Georgia and **H.E. Ms. Natalie Sabanadze**, Ambassador to Belgium and Luxemburg and Head of Georgian Mission to the EU.



The French Ambassador Salins briefed the Council members on the current state and future of EU-Georgia and France-Georgia relations. Mr. Salins stated that by concluding the negotiations on the Association Agreement and the Deep and Comprehensive Free Trade Area (DCFTA), Georgia enters an important phase in the relations with the EU. It is therefore crucial, he said, that the legal and institutional reforms launched in the country during the negotiations are successfully implemented in the coming years. The Ambassador stressed that the role and active involvement of the business community in this important reform process is vital.

Ambassador Sabanadze greeted the EUGBC members and informed that she will depart for Brussels in few days. Ms. Sabanadze thereby underlined that the meeting with EUGBC is her first official meeting in her role as Ambassador. Ambassador Sabanadze spoke about the implication of the Association Agreement, including DCFTA for Georgia and for the businesses at large. To this end, she emphasized the importance of EUGBC activities and stated that the Georgian Embassy in Belgium and Luxemburg and the Mission to the EU will ensure close cooperation with the Council as well as with wider business community in Georgia and in the EU.

EUGBC Chairman of Board and Secretary General met with the State Minister for European and Euro-Atlantic Integration, Alex Petriashvili

On June 18th, 2013 the Chairman of EUGBC Board, **Emanuel Haton** and Secretary General, **Zviad Chumburidze** met with the State Minister on European and Euro-Atlantic Integration, **Alex Petriashvili**.

The sides discussed the issues concerning Association Agreement with the EU and its integral part Deep and Comprehensive Free Trade Area agreement. The State Minister pointed out that Georgia attaches particular importance to the economic integration with the European Union, and trade-related reforms are underway in all areas. Also, the process of harmonization with the EU legislation is developing actively.



Emanuel Haton noted that the EU-Georgia Business Council is interested in supporting the process of exporting of Georgian goods to the EU market. He also noted that one of the priorities of EUGBC is supporting the development of small and medium-sized businesses. During the meeting, it was also mentioned that EUGBC plans to open its representative office in Tbilisi.

On June 18th, 2013 the newly-appointed Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of Georgia to the Republic of Austria (former Secretary General of EUGBC), **Mr Konstantine Zaldastanishvili**, presented his credentials to the Austrian Federal President, **Mr Heinz Fischer**.

The two held a meeting after the official ceremony in the Hofburg Palace in Vienna, during which they discussed various current issues concerning bilateral relations between Georgia and Austria, the political situation in Georgia, the forthcoming parliamentary elections in Austria and the country's relations with its neighbours.

With the goal of further deepening bilateral relations, the Georgian ambassador invited the Austrian President to visit Georgia.

At the end of the meeting, an Austrian military orchestra played the national anthems of both countries.

The Secretary General of the North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO), Mr. Anders Fogh Rasmussen visited Georgia

At the invitation of the Georgian authorities, the North Atlantic Council visited Georgia on June 26th-27th 2013. The North Atlantic Council is the principal political decision-making body within NATO. The Council is chaired by the NATO Secretary General. It brings together high level representatives of each member country to discuss policy or operational questions that require collective decisions.

The NATO Delegation was chaired by NATO Secretary General Mr. **Anders Fogh Rasmussen**. This was the third visit of the NAC to Georgia in the last five years. The NAC visit attests to the intensive relations and successful cooperation between Georgia and the Alliance.





In the framework of the visit, the NATO-Georgia Commission was held with the participation of Georgian Prime-Minister, **Bidzina Ivanishvili**. In the framework of the visit, the NATO Secretary General held bilateral meetings with the Georgian Prime-Minister, the President, the Chairman of the Parliament, the leader of the Parliamentary minority and the Minister of Foreign Affairs. The Secretary General had a working dinner with the Minister of Defence and the Secretary of the Security Council. The NATO Secretary General also delivered a speech at a meeting with students, and greeted Georgian soldiers prior to their departure for participation in the ISAF mission in Afghanistan.

NATO Ambassadors also held meetings with the representatives of non-governmental and international organizations and the media.

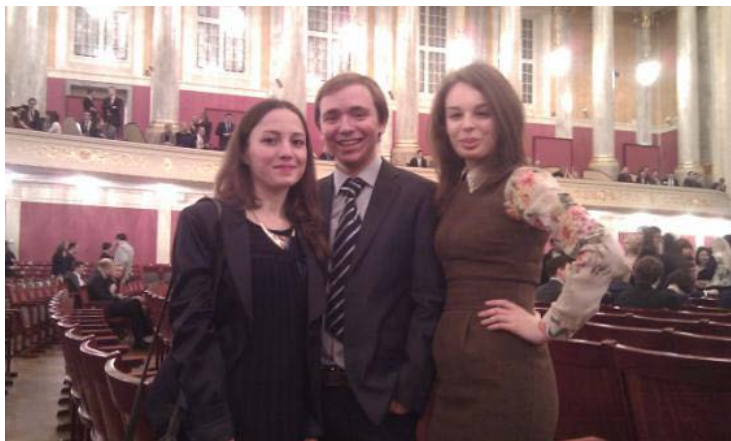
